Students completing a Bachelor of Arts in Africana Studies must complete 12 units in Complementary Studies in courses bearing a prefix other than AFRS or courses cross-listed with AFRS. These units may be in

- a. a language other than English;
- b. one course from each AA S, AFRS, LTNS, and RRS;
- c. four courses from one prefix: AA S or AFRS or LTNS or RRS;
- d. a minor or certificate;
- e. units earned in a study abroad program; or
- f. a coherent group of courses complementary to the major.

With the approval of an advisor in the major, courses which fulfill the Complementary Studies requirement may be lower- or upper-division units, resident, or transfer units.

Consider taking a class combined with a laboratory or a separate lab to fulfill B3 if not already satisfied.

Area of Emphasis (9 units)

Area Emphasis

Students are required to focus on an area of emphasis in Africana Studies, American Indian Studies, Asian American Studies, Latina/ Latino Studies, or Race and Resistance Studies. Courses selected to fulfill the emphasis will provide a student with the subject matter foundation to complete the culminating research project field study or thesis. Upon advisement, upper-division/graduate coursework in the College of Ethnic Studies and other departments on campus may be used.
